

English First Peoples Creative Writing 10

Learning Outcomes: The activities in this course are based on the core competencies and curricular competencies as provided by the Ministry of Education of BC and will introduce students to four key ideas: The exploration of text and story deepens our understanding of diverse, complex ideas about identity, others, and the world; self-representation through authentic First Peoples text is a means to foster justice; texts are socially, culturally, geographically, and historically constructed, First Peoples texts play a role within the process of Reconciliation.

Resources: All resources are provided within the course, other than a novel. Students will need good access to the Internet and will be required to use online tools.

Exams: All exams and quizzes require a password and are to be invigilated by a teacher at your school or an approved testing center. Exams may be rewritten if needed. Exams may cause anxiety for some students. See your teacher for study skills if necessary.

Communication: Assignments are submitted directly through your course. Constant communication with your teacher is key to success in a DL course. Phone or email or message your teacher for help whenever necessary.

Goal Setting: This course is self-paced and self-directed. Students should plan on working 5-6 hours a week on this course. It is highly recommended that the student creates a calendar of monthly, weekly and even daily goals. Contact your teacher if help is needed doing this.
